The table above describes funding opportunities for Early Career Researchers and is split into Science and A&H&SS for convenience. There is some duplication across these categories.

Standard grant schemes are shaded blue and have specific caveats surrounding non-permanent HEI employees applying for grants. All other schemes are Fellowship schemes.

Note that 100% of time for a PI would be on average £114k p.a. including Estates and Indirect costs (Classroom rate), so AHRC and ESRC awards can only support PI salaries for a reduced grant duration.

\*The ESRC New Investigator scheme's ethos is to provide leadership training for the PI, especially in leading a team. This is in conflict with claiming 100% for salary costs for the project duration.

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
